Lesson 1: The Miracle Worker

Theme: Jesus reveals God's heart through His healing power.

- ❖ Jesus' earthly ministry was filled with miracles that revealed His compassion and authority as the Son of God.
- ❖ His miracles were not just displays of power, but demonstrations of the Kingdom of God breaking into the world.
- ❖ They remind us that Jesus still heals and delivers today.

Key Scriptures:

- Matthew 4:23–24 – Jesus healed every disease and affliction.
- Luke 4:18–19 – “The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me... to heal the brokenhearted.”
- Mark 1:40–42 – The leper made clean.
- Mark 5:25–34 – The woman with the issue of blood.
- John 9:1–7 – Healing the man born blind.
- John 11:43–44 – Raising Lazarus.
- Hebrews 13:8 – Jesus Christ the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Teaching Points:

1. **Jesus' miracles showed compassion** (Matthew 14:14). He healed because He cared.
2. **Miracles validated His identity** as Messiah (John 10:37–38).
3. **His power was not limited** – He healed all who came in faith (Matthew 8:16).
4. **Faith was often the key** – “Your faith has made you whole” (Mark 5:34).
5. **Miracles point to spiritual truths** – Lazarus' resurrection foreshadows eternal life.

Discussion & Reflection:

- What do the miracles of Jesus reveal about God's love and power?
- Why do you think Jesus often connected faith with healing?
- Share a testimony of when God worked a miracle in your life.

Lesson 2: Spiritual Healing

Theme: Our greatest need is healing of the soul.

Key Scriptures:

- Isaiah 53:5 – By His wounds we are healed.
- Psalm 51:10–12 – “Create in me a clean heart.”
- Psalm 32 – David’s testimony of guilt, confession, and restoration.
- Jeremiah 17:14 – “Heal me, O Lord, and I shall be healed.”
- Ezekiel 36:26 – “I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you.”
- Luke 19:10 – Jesus came to seek and save the lost.
- John 3:3–7 – “You must be born again.”
- Ephesians 2:1–5 – From death in sin to life in Christ.
- 1 Peter 2:24 – By His stripes we were healed.

Being Sin-Sick – Psalm 32:1-5

- ❖ Sin drains our spiritual strength – Psalm 38:3–8; Isaiah 1:5-6
- ❖ Guilt is a heavy burden on the heart – Proverbs 28:13; Psalm 32:4
- ❖ Confession releases the burden and weight – Psalm 32:5; 1 John 1:9
- ❖ Forgiveness restores joy and peace – Psalm 32:1; Romans 5:1
- ❖ Renewal comes through a cleansed heart – Psalm 51:10-12
 - David asks for and receives more...restoration, joy, purity, purpose and revival

Application: Many believers are spiritually weak because of unconfessed sin. The cure for this sickness begins at repentance. When we uncover sin, God covers it with mercy.

Points to remember:

1. Only Christ can cure our sin disease – Romans 6:23
2. Healing begins with repentance and humility before God – James 5:16
3. Forgiveness and renewal bring new life – 2 Corinthians 5:17
4. Jesus is the Great Physician – Luke 5:31–32
5. We have to let it go and fully receive the finished work of spiritual healing and restoration. Isa. 53:4-5; 1 Peter 2:24

Lesson 3: Can God Use You in the Healing and Deliverance of Others?

Theme: Every believer is called to be a vessel through whom God's healing and deliverance flow.

Theological Implications:

1. Faith is the conduit of divine power – Mark 9:23; Mat. 17:20; Heb. 11:6
2. Spiritual power requires spiritual discipline – Mark 9:29; Mat. 6:6; 1 Cor. 9:27
3. Obstacles reveal our dependence on God – Psalm 61:2-4; 2 Cor. 12:9-10
4. Deliverance may look worse before it gets better – Mark 9:26; Psa. 30:5; Exo. 5:22-23
5. Believers are commissioned to heal and deliver – Mark 16:17–18; Romans 8:11

Points from Sunday's Sermon and Supporting Scriptures:

- ❖ Believers in the background are as important as those in the forefront – 1 Cor. 12:14–22
 - Every part of the body of Christ contributes to God's work; intercessors and unseen servants sustain those who minister publicly.
- ❖ The world expects Jesus in you – Matthew 5:14–16; Galatians 2:20
 - Believers carry Christ's presence, and the world looks for evidence of His power through our compassion and faith.
- ❖ To those let down by Jesus' disciples before, Jesus still heals, delivers, and saves – Mark 9:18–19; Hebrews 7:25
- ❖ What we do in private prepares us for what we will face in public – Mat 6:6; Luke 5:16
- ❖ Are you praying and fasting? Mat. 17:21; Acts 13:2–3

Practical Teaching Points:

1. Be spiritually prepared through prayer and fasting.
2. Stay available and sensitive to the Holy Spirit.
3. Walk in humility; power belongs to God.
4. Don't get discouraged when things look worse — it may signal breakthrough.
5. Keep your faith active and steadfast.
6. Remember unseen believers are vital to the mission — unity brings victory.

Closing Prayer:

Lord, make me a vessel of Your healing and deliverance. Prepare my heart through prayer and fasting. Strengthen my faith to believe even when things appear worse. Use my life as a channel of Your power and compassion. Amen.
